DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday Morning – June 1, 1999

PRAISE AND SINGING: At 9:45 a.m., Lori Blair, Song Leader for the Conference, led the Delegates in a time of praise and singing.

CONFERENCE CONVENES: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox presented Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson to the Conference. He was warmly received by the delegates. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called the Conference to order at 10:00 a.m. Mark Jaeger led the Conference in the singing of the hymn, "And Are We Yet Alive." Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson led the Conference in a time of prayer. The Processional featured the song, "Dare to Share Jesus" written by Mark Jaeger. Mark Jaeger led the Conference in the singing of the hymns, "Lead On O King Eternal," "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing," and "Here I Am, Lord." Bishop J. Lloyd Knox led the Conference in a time of prayer. Barbara H. Odom, Vice-Chairperson of the BICAP Task Force, spoke about the efforts of the Bishops' Initiative on Children and Poverty. She reported that as of today, the churches of the Florida United Methodist Conference have contributed \$291,131.53 to the BICAP Initiative. She also reported that \$256,700 of this amount has been given in grants to 95 churches throughout the Conference. She challenged the churches of the Conference to join in a "Daring for Dollars Campaign" to further the work of the BICAP Initiative. An offering was received for the Bishops' Initiative. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson introduced Mary Alice Massey, Conference Lay Leader. She delivered the Homily based on the words of Matthew 28:16-20. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson and Bishop J. Lloyd Knox were the celebrants for the service of Holy Communion. The Conference joined in the singing of the hymn "Give Thanks." Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson thanked Bishop J. Lloyd Knox for his leadership while he was receiving treatments and then offered the Benediction. The Conference was adjourned until 1:45 p.m.

BAR OF THE CONFERENCE: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary, moved that the Bar of the Conference be the entire downstairs floor of the arena including the risers in the back and the “accessible seating only” sections of section 105-109 and 123-127. Only those within the BAR of the Conference will be permitted to vote. Section 107 is reserved for Mrs. Henderson and spouses

of Bishop Henderson's cabinet and their guests. The balcony will be available for guests of the Conference.

REGISTRATION: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary, explained that it is very important that everyone register at the registration desk. Registration will be from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. today through Wednesday. Clergy registration will be in Exhibit Hall East and Lay Registration will be in the lobby of the main entrance. Thursday through Saturday, registration will be with the Rolls Secretaries at the side of the stage.

PROGRAM COMMITTEE: E. Keith Ewing, Chair, gave thanks for the presence of Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson to preside over the session. He noted some special precautions that need to be observed to ensure the continued health of the Bishop throughout the Conference. He gave the report found on page 14 of the Workbook. He thanked all of those who have worked so hard to make this a very special Conference for us all. (See Reports)

PROCEDURES AND AGENDA COMMITTEE: James F. Jennings, Chair, gave the report of the committee found on page 14 of the Workbook. He explained the method for persons to be recognized by the Bishop during the Conference. Moved adoption of the report. Motion carried. (See Reports)

COMMITTEE ON EPISCOPACY: Riley Short, Chair, gave the report for the Committee on Episcopacy. He presented Bishop and Mrs. Knox and thanked them for all that they have done for the Conference during Bishop Henderson's illness. Riley Short presented Mrs. Henderson to the Conference. The Conference warmly received them all. He then presented others who work in the Conference office. They included: Joanna K. Proferes, SheandolenDunn, and Virginia Kelly. They were greeted by the Conference. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson then shared with the Committee and the Conference his profound thanks for all of the support that he has received throughout his illness.

ELECTION PROCEDURES COMMITTEE: James F. Harnish, Chair, gave the report of the committee. He talked about the "human" dimension of the process for elections to Conference. He also noted his belief in the presence and the power of the Holy Spirit to guide and direct the process. The report of the committee is found on pages 7 and 8 of the workbook. Further instructions for the election process will be given at the Lay and Clergy sessions. He asked the Conference to join him in a time of prayer for the election process that we are about to begin. He then moved the adoption of the report of the committee. It was adopted. (See Reports)

BOARD OF ORDAINED MINISTRY: Deborah McLeod, Chair, moved for the suspension of Standing Rule 5A4E in order to conduct the business of the clergy session. Motion carried.

CONFERENCE ADJOURNS FOR LAY AND CLERGY SESSIONS: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson adjourned the Conference at 2:30 for the Lay Orientation Session and the Clergy Executive Session.

CONFERENCE RECONVENES: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called the Conference back into session at 4:20 p.m.

OPERATION EVANGELISM: Joseph R. MacLaren, Chair, asked the delegates to find the Dare to Share Jesus Card in their packet. He challenged each delegate to fill out the card with their own response. He also asked the delegates to take notice of the instructional pamphlet about sharing Christ found in their packet. He shared several stories about successful strategies for evangelism being used throughout the Conference. He also thanked Dr. Robert Fox for his devotion and dedication to Project Evangelization. He introduced Dr. Roger K. Swanson, the new Director of Operation Evangelization for our Conference. Dr. Swanson spoke to the Conference about some of his goals and plans for sharing Jesus. He noted that we have a tremendous climate for growth in our Conference. He stated his own beliefs that Jesus Christ is the Lord and Savior of all, that we are in the business of making disciples, and that evangelism is not a program of the church but a congregational lifestyle. He promised to offer a listening ear and a helping hand as a partner in the mission of the church. Joseph MacLaren spoke about the Share Jesus Mission. He noted that 18 churches in the Jacksonville District will be hosting a Share Jesus Mission this summer. He called on the Rev. Terresa Hill, District Superintendent of the Jacksonville District, to speak about what the Share Jesus Mission has meant to her. She challenged each delegate to get involved in a Share Jesus Mission this summer. A video about the Share Jesus Mission was shown to the Conference. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson spoke to the Conference about the priority of evangelism for our Conference. "There is no higher priority for us," he said.

FOUNDATION FOR EVANGELISM: Jimmie Crook, with the Foundation for Evangelism, spoke about the new relationship that Dr. Swanson has with this Conference and of his excitement about our priority on evangelism. He noted that the Harry Denman Awards for evangelism will be presented at the picnic this evening. He thanked the Conference for its commitment to evangelism. He further noted that the Share Jesus Movement has been, and will be offered through several churches throughout the Conference. He thanked the UMM for their gifts of \$14,800 to the Foundation.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF ORDAINED MINISTRY: Deborah A. McLeod, Chair, completed the report of the Board of Ordained Ministry as found on pages 27-28 in the Workbook. She presented Professional Certificates to Joanne Lovell Kelly, and Carol V. Marsh, who have completed the requirements for certification. She congratulated those who have just completed their Course of Study work. She shared the materials found in Part III of the Board's Report related to Diaconal Ministers. She then asked those to be ordained to come

forward to respond to the questions for ordination. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson asked the candidates the Historic Questions for ordination. Each of the candidates answered in the affirmative. Deborah thanked all of those who help to expedite the work of the Board. (See Reports)

UNITED METHODIST PUBLISHING HOUSE: Gary Thomas of the United Methodist Publishing House brought greetings to the Conference from the Board of the Publishing House. He commented on the tremendous success of the Disciple Bible Study in the church. He told the Conference about several new studies for personal growth now available to the church through the Publishing House. He told about some of the changes coming to the Publishing House, including an Internet presence. He told of the tradition of the Publishing House to give back to each Conference a portion of the proceeds from sales of materials. This year, the amount presented to the Florida Annual Conference was \$22,772.97. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson received the check from Gary, and thanked him, and the Publishing House for their generous offering to the Conference.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary, reminded the Conference that the deadline for submitting resolutions for consideration by the Conference ends with the close of this Conference session. Several announcements relating to committee meeting room assignments were also made.

BENEDICTION: Dr. Ray Finklea offered the Benediction to close this session of the Conference.

Wednesday Morning - June 2, 1999

MUSIC AND SINGING: At 8:20 a.m. Lori Blair led the Conference in several hymns and songs

CONFERENCE CONVENES: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox called the Conference to order at 8:30 a.m. Dan Parrish gave the morning prayer.

BIBLE STUDY: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox presented Geraldine W. McClellan, Pastor of Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church, as the Bible Study leader of the Conference. She was warmly received by the Conference. Her scripture for the Study was from 2 Corinthians 1:3-4.

ORGANIZATION OF THE DAY: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox welcomed Bishop and Mrs. Bashore to the Conference. They were warmly received. He then introduced Glen Mitchell, Conference Parliamentarian, who led the Conference in a moment of prayer.

COMMITTEE ON JOURNAL: Dan Parrish reported for the Committee on Journal. The minutes of Tuesday's proceedings have been examined and found to be in order. Motion was made to accept. The motion was approved.

BALLOT #1: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox introduced Jim Harnish who gave instruction to the Conference about the balloting procedures. Bishop J. Lloyd Knox called on J.C. Powell who led the Conference in prayer. Voting began following the prayer.

COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS: Gerald F. Van Dyken, Jr, Chair, presented the preliminary report of the committee. He stated that there are 18 resolutions for consideration by the Conference. The first is entitled "Fairness in Representation" and is found on page 96 of the Workbook. The second is entitled "Wesley Hymns" and is found at the Usher's Table. The third is entitled "Iraq" and is found on page 25 of the Welcome Book. The fourth is entitled "Accountability" and is found on page 24 of the Welcome Book. The fifth is entitled "Abortion" and is found on page 22 of the Welcome Book. The sixth is entitled "Gambling" and is found at the Usher's Table. The seventh is entitled "Student Day Offering" and is found at the Usher's Table. The eighth is entitled "Black College and Universities" and is found at the Usher's Table. The ninth is entitled "Knowledge of Church Matters" and is found at the Usher's Table. The tenth is entitled "Conferences" and is found at the Usher's Table. The eleventh is entitled "Gay Teen Suicide" and is found at the Usher's Table. The twelfth is entitled "Dioxine-Free Future" and is found on page 17 of the Welcome Book. The thirteenth is entitled "Peace With Justice" and is found on page 18 of the Welcome Book. The fourteenth is entitled "Hearing Impaired" and is found on page 19 of the Welcome Book. COMMITTEE ON STANDING RULES: Robert H. Grizzard, Chair, presented the report of the committee found on page 15 of the Welcome Book. He then asked the delegates to turn to page 80 of the Workbook for the recommended changes to the Standing Rules. Each of these 5 recommendations were placed before the Conference and voted on independently. All 5 recommendations were approved by the Conference. (See Reports)

COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary, presented the Nominations Report found on pages 10-11 of the Welcome Book. She made several corrections to the Report. Bishop J. Lloyd Knox called for a vote on the Report. Motion to accept nominations carried. (See Reports.)

COMMITTEE ON NEW CHURCH DEVELOPMENT AND CHURCH RE-DEVELOPMENT: Paul B. Butler and Charles W. Courtoy presented a video about the work and findings of the Committee to the Conference. The video highlighted the findings of the Percept study done on the Florida Annual Conference. It also highlighted the plans and goals of the Committee to further the work of Church development throughout the Conference. Mr. Butler again reaffirmed the power of the New Church Development process to connect people with Jesus Christ and to help them to become devoted disciples of Jesus. He challenged each delegate to review the maps and charts found near the Cokesbury display to see how their church fared in this study. He then asked

the Conference to turn to pages 75-78 in the Workbook. He made a brief update to the report. He noted that there have been 3 new church starts in 1997, 4 in 1998, and 6 in 1999. It is hoped that 8 new churches will be started in 2000. There are two motions needing action found on pages 76-78 of the Workbook. The first motion relates to the New Church Start Budget Request for 2000. The motion carried. The second motion relates to a Policy for use of funds derived from the sale of closed, abandoned or discontinued churches. Bill Fisackerly asked for a clarification related to merged churches. Vic Kovak asked for clarification related to mortgage payments on local church property. Roger Moore asked for further clarification related to churches which merge. Jim Lewis moved to amend the resolution to allocate 40% to go to new church development following a sale. Amendment seconded. Discussion was held on the amendment. Paul Butler spoke on behalf of the committee stating their comfort with the motion as placed before the Conference. Jim Lewis withdrew his amendment to the motion of the committee. Recommendation of the committee was voted on. Motion carried. Mr. Butler then thanked a number of people who share in the work of the committee. The Conference acknowledged them. (See Reports)

FLORIDA UNITED METHODIST FOUNDATION: Bruce Baker, Chair, called the Foundation into order as a Corporation. He noted that the minutes and the report can be found on pages 64-65 of the Workbook. He commented that the Foundation has grown tremendously through the past few years. It has more assets than many banks in the State. He asked if there was any new business to be discussed. Being none, the official meeting of the Foundation was adjourned. He thanked many who worked so hard to make the Foundation the success that it is today. (See Reports)

BALLOT #1 (SECOND BALLOT): Bishop J. Lloyd Knox explained that the first clergy ballot has been invalidated. There was an error on the sheet which contained an omission in the listing of the names of the candidates. We will redo clergy ballot #1 because of the error. Budd Johnson offered a prayer before the election.

CONNECTIONAL PROCESS TEAM: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox called Bill Walker to explain some of the intricacies of the Connectional relationship between local churches. He asked the delegates to turn to the document entitled "Transforming the United Methodist Church for the 21st Century." He then introduced Anna Gail Workman to present the information contained in the document. She spoke of her great desire to gain input and information related to some of the proposals under consideration. The Committee is comprised of 38 people. They have met 7 times over the span of approximately 30 days. There have been small on-going study groups working tirelessly in between the meetings of the whole committee. They have been working closely with all of the major Committees and Agencies of the church. This first draft is a working draft intended to introduce dialogue throughout the denomination. The first draft has proposed 11

transformational changes for the church to discuss. Each of these 11 transformational changes places a high priority on personal and institutional spirituality to make our mission to make disciples our chief goal as a church. She spoke about the rationale and reasoning for each of these 11 items. She would be available throughout the day to answer any question that any delegate might have.

BALLOT RESULTS: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox read the results of Lay ballot #1. There were 774 ballots cast. There were 23 invalid ballots. There were a total of 752 valid ballots. 377 votes were needed to elect. There was 1 election - Mary Alice Massey with 465 votes. Bishop J. Lloyd Knox then read the results of clergy ballot #1. There were 409 ballots cast. There were 14 invalid ballots. There were a total of 395 valid ballots. 198 votes were needed to elect. There were no elections. John Denmark made the motion to not read the names of those who have less than 25 votes. Motion carried.

BALLOT #2: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox called on Harold Busey to offer a prayer. Voting began following the prayer.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary, announced that the first eight rows of the center and left sections of the auditorium are reserved for the Memorial Service.

ADJOURNMENT: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox called on Rogers P. Fair to give the benediction. The Conference was adjourned at 11:57 p.m.

Wednesday Afternoon - June 2, 1999

MUSIC AND SONG: At 1:45 p.m. Lori Blair led the Conference in several hymns and songs.

WORSHIP - MEMORIAL SERVICE: At 2:00 p.m. Sharon E. Patch called the Conference to order for the start of the Memorial Service. Denzil Southwood-Smith led the greeting. Nelida Morales led the Conference in prayer. Agnes Watson read the scriptures for the service. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson introduced Bishop George Bashore to the Conference. He delivered a sermon that addressed the power of God to offer comfort and help and hope to us in the midst of the difficult moments of our lives. He charged each congregation to become 911 centers to offer caring to those with need of the faith we profess. He urged the church to receive the mercy of God's grace at the cross and to give it out to others around us. Offering comfort to others is our task as the church. We need to dare to share Jesus if we are going to give people comfort and life. The church needs to learn what it means to be marked with the cross of Christ so that we can bring comfort to the world in which we live. We are not to fear, but to trust and obey. We are called to adopt a cruciform form of life forever. Sharon E. Patch and Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary, read the names

of those who have died during this past year. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson gave the benediction. The service ended at 3:30 p.m.

BREAK: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson placed the Conference in a 10 minute recess.

CONFERENCE RECONVENES: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox introduced Marta Burke who gave the opening prayer for this session of the Conference.

BALLOT RESULTS: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox read the results of Lay ballot #2. There were 790 ballots cast. There were 50 invalid ballots. There were a total of 740 valid ballots. 371 votes were needed to elect. There was 1 election - T. Terrell Sessums with 386 votes. Bishop J. Lloyd Knox then read the results of clergy ballot #2. There were 406 ballots cast. There were 6 invalid ballots. There were a total of 400 valid ballots. 201 votes were needed to elect. There were 5 elections - Richard J. Wills, Jr. with 255 votes, Teresa L. Hill with 228 votes, James A. Harnish with 222 votes, Philip H. Roughton with 214 votes, and William S. Barnes with 212 votes.

BALLOT #3: Bishop J. Lloyd Knox called on Vicki Walker to come and lead the Conference in prayer. After the ballot was closed, Jim Rosenberg moved that the names of those who have received less than 50 votes not be named through the end of General Conference voting. Bill Fisackerly offered a substitute motion to read the names of those down to one half of those needed for election. Substitute motion failed. Original motion prevailed.

COMMISSION ON EQUITABLE COMPENSATION: Harry R. Hoston, Chair, gave the report of the committee. He spoke of the status of the Langer motion from last year's Conference. The committee is still working on this concern. He asked the delegates to turn to pages 35-37 for their recommendations for equitable salary considerations. The motion for the figures for year 2000 equitable salaries was placed before the Conference. Motion carried. The motion for year 2000 funding was placed before the Conference. Motion carried. (See Reports)

BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND CAMPUS MINISTRY: T. Terrell Sessums presented the report of the committee. He presented Gishawn Mance as the recipient of the Lina McCord Intern Award for the Black College Fund. Jana Hart spoke about some of the exciting things going on in Campus Ministry throughout the Conference. She introduced Alex Shanks as the first official representative of the new United Methodist Student Movement. Mr. Sessums thanked all of those who work so hard on the committee. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson introduced Dr. Tom Reushling, President of Florida Southern College. He spoke about the many exciting things taking place on the campus of Florida Southern College. He thanked the members of the Board of Trustees for their hard work on behalf of the College. He challenged each local church to advertise

the ministry of Florida Southern College and to encourage young people to consider Florida Southern College when choosing an institution of higher learning. He gave an update on the Endowment Program and on the building program. He spoke about the matching fund program between the College and the local churches. There are 40 students studying for full-time service in the life of the local church. He spoke about a special summer event designed to help students to learn more about Florida Southern College. He introduced Brenda K. Lewis, the new Chaplain for the College. Mr. Sessums asked the Conference to support the resolution to amend the Charter of Florida Southern College. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson asked for questions to the amendment. Vote was called. Motion carried. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson introduced Kathy Kirsher to share news from United Theological Seminary. She spoke about the commitment of the seminary to support the ongoing task of training the leaders of the church. Their new Doctor of Ministry Program will focus on the area of community evangelism. The Seminary will also be looking at the possibility of starting a Lay Academy to provide theological training for the laity of the Conference.

DARE TO SHARE JESUS VIDEO CLIPS: The video showed the effects of actively sharing the Good News of Jesus with others.

COMMISSION ON RELIGION AND RACE: Arnett Smith, Chair, spoke about the work of the Commission. He directed the delegates to turn to the report of the Commission on pages 78-79 of the Workbook. He noted that the Commission is involved in on-going training related to racial sensitivity, diversity, and inclusiveness. A training event for the Cabinet will be offered on personal and institutional racism. He also asked that each local church coordinator for Religion and Race to also be trained in the areas above. He spoke of the work of the Commission to sponsor a racial diversity event at the Annual Conference. He also spoke about the hope to establish a Resource Center in the United Methodist Building where persons can learn more about the above issues and concerns. (See Reports)

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay ballot #3. There were 800 ballots cast. There were 39 invalid ballots. There were a total of 761 valid ballots. 381 votes were needed to elect. There were 5 elections - Katie McEntire with 426 votes, Lynette Fields with 399 votes, Rodell F. Roberts with 399 votes, Betty Sue Mason with 390 votes, and Ressie Mae Bass with 381 votes. Carmen then read the results of clergy ballot #3. There were 396 ballots cast. There were 16 invalid ballots. There were a total of 380 valid ballots. 191 votes were needed to elect. There were no elections.

BALLOT #4: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on David White to offer the prayer before the vote. Voting began.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson announced that the reports that have yet to be completed will be first on the agenda when the Conference reconvenes at 7:15 p.m. Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary, made several announcements at this time. She read a telegram from Bishop Kammerer.

ADJOURNMENT: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Rod Johnson to give the benediction. The Conference adjourned at 5:23 p.m.

Wednesday Night - June 2, 1999

MUSIC AND SONG: At 7:10 p.m. Lori Blair led the Conference in the singing of a hymn.

CONFERENCE RECONVENES: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called the Conference back to order at 7:15 p.m.

NEW CHURCH RECOGNITION: A video was shown about two of our newest churches in the Conference, Ray of Hope United Methodist Church in Tallahassee, and Crossroads United Methodist Church in Sarasota.

PRESENTATION OF APPOINTMENTS TO EXTENSION MINISTRY CLERGY: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson asked those who serve in appointments in extended ministry settings to come to the podium and introduce themselves. They were all warmly received by the Conference.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay ballot #4. There were 732 ballots cast. There were 40 invalid ballots. There were a total of 692 valid ballots. 347 votes were needed to elect. There were no elections. Carmen then read the results of clergy ballot #4. There were 362 ballots cast. There were 12 invalid ballots. There were a total of 350 valid ballots. 176 votes were needed to elect. There were 3 elections - James F. Jennings with 200 votes, Deborah A. McLeod with 192 votes, and Dan G. Johnson with 184 votes.

BALLOT #5: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Jim Harnish to present statistics of the delegates elected thus far. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Candido Perez to offer the prayer before the vote. Voting began.

ARCHIVES AND HISTORY RECOGNITION OF ANNIVERSARY CHURCHES: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Nell Thrift to recognize 7 of the 13 anniversary churches tonight. St. Paul's of Ocala is celebrating its 25th anniversary. High Point of Clearwater is celebrating its 50th anniversary. First of Hollywood, St. John's of Miami Beach, Allendale of St. Petersburg, Child's Park of St. Petersburg, and Wesley Memorial of St. Petersburg are celebrating their 75th anniversary. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called Bob Barber to the podium to speak about the new Archives and History Building. He reported that

to date \$350,000 of the \$450,000 construction costs for the building have been raised. He made the motion on behalf of the Board of Trustees to allow the start of construction of the new Archives Building following the provisions of the motion found on page 14 of the Welcome Book. Motion carried. (See Reports)

FLORIDA CONFERENCE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: Bob Barber, reporting for Norris Counts, Chair of the Trustees, stated that all Conference funds are invested in appropriate accounts with acceptable returns. All properties, but two, the United Methodist Building and the Episcopal Office, are in good order and repair. The Trustees are proposing a five year rotating maintenance plan for upkeep. The Trustees are recommending that repairs and/or renovations to the two properties above be high on the list of projects to accomplish. Making these renovations at the same time as the construction of the new Archives Building will greatly reduce the costs. The estimated costs for the renovation will be \$1,400,000. The Trustees are requesting the annual Conference to allow the renovation work to begin following the plan outlined on page 14 of the Welcome Book. Several comments and questions came from the floor. Bob Standifer moved that established agencies of the Conference that are already utilizing the building be exempt from the additional costs as outlined in the original motion. There was discussion on the amendment. Bishop called for the vote on the amendment. The amendment failed. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called for the vote on the original motion. Motion carried. (See Reports)

CRUSADE SCHOLAR PROGRAM: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Larry Rankin to present the two recipients of this year's award. The recipients are: Yenya Andrade and David Kim.

FLORIDA UNITED METHODIST CREDIT UNION: Robert T. Standifer, Chair, gave the report of the Credit Union found on page 49 of the Workbook. This is the 30th year anniversary of the Credit Union. He gave an update on the financial strength of the Credit Union. He spoke about some of the new programs being offered by the Credit Union to its members. He addressed the Y2K contingency plans of the Credit Union. He spoke about the new Web Site being developed by the Credit Union. The Credit Union has again received a five-star rating. He thanked the staff and Board of Directors for their hard work through the year. (See Reports)

DARE TO SHARE JESUS VIDEO CLIP: A video was shown which portrayed some of the ways that we can dare to share Jesus in our local churches.

FLORIDA COUNCIL OF CHURCHES: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Fred Morris to speak about the work of the Council of Churches. He affirmed the oneness of the church in its ministry and mission. He called for a celebration of the oneness of the church under the influence of the Holy Spirit. He said that it is time for us to embrace unity in the Spirit in our lifetime as well. He spoke

about some of the social issues affecting us that only the unity of the church can adequately address.

NEW CHURCH RECOGNITION: A video was shown highlighting the start of a two new ethnic churches in our Conference. The two churches include a new Brazilian Church meeting in First United Methodist Church in Kissimmee, and a new Hispanic Church meeting at St. John's United Methodist Church in Sebring.

RECOGNITION OF 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF CLERGY: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Nell Thrift to present certificates to those clergy celebrating their 25th anniversary in ministry. Those being honored include: William S. Barnes, R. Paul Bauer, Robert G. Bruce, Jr., Alexander C. Carmichel IV, Howard E. Chenault, Kenneth W. Cocker, Neo N. Garvin, Robert M. Gibbs, David J. Knapp, Warren D. Langer, Jr., William G. Larrison, Vincent S. Malkinski, Thomas W. McCloskey, Steven L. Miller, Larry A. Purvis, Barbara Williams Riddle, James R. Rosenburg, John Rutland-Wallis, Pamela A. Stewart.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay ballot #5. There were 635 ballots cast. There were 33 invalid ballots. There were a total of 602 valid ballots. 302 votes were needed to elect. There was 1 election - Russ Tabbert with 312 votes. Carmen then read the results of clergy ballot #5. There were 293 ballots cast. There were 9 invalid ballots. There were a total of 284 valid ballots. 143 votes were needed to elect. There was 1 election - Aldo O. Martin with 143 votes.

BALLOT #6: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Jacqueline McMillan to offer a prayer before the vote. The vote was taken.

SPECIAL CONCERT: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Mark Jaeger to introduce the musical group Trilogy from Pine Castle United Methodist Church. They provided special music for the delegates.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay ballot #6. There were 637 ballots cast. There were 26 invalid ballots. There were a total of 611 valid ballots. 306 votes were needed to elect. There were 2 elections - Pasco Cade with 337 votes, and Leland P. McKeown with 327 votes. Carmen then read the results of clergy ballot #6. There were 258 ballots cast. There were 3 invalid ballots. There were a total of 255 valid ballots. 128 votes were needed to elect. There were 3 elections - David L. Brazelton with 134 votes, Jorge A. Acevedo with 133 votes, and E. Keith Ewing with 131 votes.

BALLOT #7: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Jim McWhinnie to offer the prayer before the vote. The vote was taken.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary made one announcement.

CONFERENCE ADJOURNS: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Alex Shanks to offer the benediction. The Conference adjourned at 9:45 p.m.

Thursday Morning - June 3, 1999

MUSIC AND SONG: At 8:15 a.m. Lori Blair led the Conference in singing several hymns. Mr. Curt Oxford sang three songs for the Conference.

MORNING BIBLE STUDY: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson presented Geraldine W. McClellan, Pastor of Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church, as the Bible Study leader of the Conference. Her scripture for the Study was from Hebrews 11:1-6. Lori Blair led the Conference in the singing of several more hymns and songs of praise.

ORGANIZATION OF THE DAY: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson welcomed James Armstrong, who was warmly received by the Conference.

COMMITTEE ON JOURNAL: Nora Ramirez reported for the Committee on Journal. The minutes of Wednesday's proceedings have been examined and found to be in order. Motion was made to accept. The motion was approved.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay Ballot #7. There were 559 ballots cast. There were 7 invalid ballots. There were a total of 552 valid ballots. 227 votes were needed to elect. There was 1 election - Nelida Mora Morales with 311 votes. Carmen then read the results of Clergy Ballot #7. There were 204 ballots cast. There were no invalid ballots. There were a total of 204 valid ballots. 103 votes were needed to elect. There was no election.

BALLOT #8: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Jacqueline Leveron to lead the Conference in prayer before the vote. The voting began.

BOARD OF LAY MINISTRY: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Mary Alice Massey, Conference Lay Leader, who spoke about the wonderful call of God upon the laity in our church. Lay ministry is as varied as the gifts and graces of all of those called by God. She reminded the Conference that all have been called to be the disciples of Jesus, and nurtured by God's redeeming grace. Under the influence of the Spirit, we are called to live faithfully to God, to serve others, to love our neighbors, and to live out the demands of the gospel through our daily lives. The Board of Lay Ministry seeks to provide opportunities to encourage and strengthen the ministry of the laity. The Board meets several times a year to oversee and support all aspects of lay ministry being provided throughout the Conference. She introduced some of the District Lay Leaders present. She introduced the Presidents of the United Methodist Men, the United Methodist Women, the United Methodist Youth, and the Office of Lay Renewal.

The UMW reported that United Methodist Women gave a total of \$796,283.35 to mission ministries. We are all called to make plain the vision in our mission to women, children and youth. All members of the UMW were asked to stand. It was asked that the Conference affirm support for the Stand for Children Day events, which it did. Leland McKeown announced that the date of June 24, 2000 has been selected for the next Bishop's Invitational for Christ's Men to be held in Tallahassee. Stirring reports were also given by the Conference Youth and the Lay Witness Mission. Bishop Henderson requested a strong demonstration of appreciation for the fine work of the Board of Lay Ministry.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay ballot #8. There were 754 ballots cast. There were 33 invalid ballots. There were a total of 721 valid ballots. 361 votes were needed to elect. There was no election. Carmen then read the results of clergy ballot #8. There were 309 ballots cast. There were 3 invalid ballots. There were a total of 306 valid ballots. 154 votes were needed to elect. There was no election.

BALLOT #9: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Luc Dessieux to offer a prayer before the vote. The voting began.

MOTION TO EXTEND THE BAR OF THE CONFERENCE: Bob Dickinson made the motion to extend the Bar of the Conference to include sections 224 through 227 so that families can sit together during the Conference. Motion carried.

NEW CHURCH RECOGNITION: A video was shown highlighting two of the newest churches in our Conference: Shepherd's Community Church in Lakeland and Crossroads Community Church in Tampa.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson introduced Chris Hughes from the Southeastern Jurisdiction. He spoke about the ongoing work of the Southeastern Jurisdiction. He spoke about the partnerships that the Southeastern Jurisdiction is involved in with churches throughout the Jurisdiction. The report of the Jurisdiction begins on page 93 of the Workbook. Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson thanked Mr. Hughes for his hard work. (See Reports)

CUBA/FLORIDA COVENANT: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Bishop J. Lloyd Knox to lead us in the report as found on pages 63-63 of the Workbook. Bishop J. Lloyd Knox spoke about all of the many exciting things taking place throughout the Conference to strengthen the Cuba/Florida Covenant. Bishop J. Lloyd Knox introduced Bishop Ricardo Pereira who delivered a word from the church and people of Cuba. He delivered a sermon based on the text of Ezekiel 37:1-10. Jacqueline Leveron translated for Bishop Pereira. Bishop Henderson closed the time with a singing of "We are Standing Holy Ground" led by Lori Blair. He then offered a prayer for Bishop Pereira to take to our brothers and sisters in Cuba. (See Reports)

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay Ballot #9. There were 794 ballots cast. There were 18 invalid ballots. There were a total of 776 valid ballots. 339 votes were needed to elect. There were 2 elections - Joyce Waldon Bright with 428 votes and Frank H. Furman, Jr. with 399 votes. Carmen then read the results of Clergy Ballot #9. There were 338 ballots cast. There was 1 invalid ballot. There were a total of 337 valid ballots. 169 votes were needed to elect. There was 1 election - Charles W. Courtoy with 201 votes.

BALLOT #1 (JURISDICTIONAL): Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Debbie Mak to offer a prayer before the vote. The ballot was taken.

ARCHIVES AND HISTORY RECOGNITION OF ANNIVERSARY CHURCHES: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson introduced Nell Thrift who presented those pastors celebrating their 50th anniversary in ministry. Those being recognized were: Richard E. Blanchard, Owen C. Driskell, William S. Echols, James V. Harvester, Robert R. Lewis, Francis L. Luce, Bishop Earnest W. Newman, R. Eugene Rutland Jr., Carl D. Shafer, and Gordon H. Strickland

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Kenneth L. Minton gave several announcements. He also read a letter of greeting from Bishop and Mrs. Robert Fannin. Bishop Henderson requested that the Conference Secretary be instructed to respond with letters of appreciation to Bishops Kammerer and Fannin.

ADJOURNMENT: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on David Dodge to give the closing prayer. Conference was adjourned at 12:06 p.m.

Thursday Afternoon - June 3, 1999

MUSIC AND SONG: At 1:45 p.m. Lori Blair led the Conference in music and praise.

CONFERENCE RECONVENES: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called the Conference to order at 2:00 p.m.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay Ballot #1. There were 793 ballots cast. There were 41 invalid ballots. There were a total of 752 valid ballots. 377 votes were needed to elect. There were 4 elections - Emily Ann Zimmerman with 479 votes, Joseph J. Ha with 470 votes, Jody Parks Moxley with 418 votes, and James W. Yost with 404 votes. Carmen then read the results of Clergy Ballot #1. There were 374 ballots cast. There were 9 invalid ballots. There was a total of 365 valid ballots cast. 183 votes were needed to elect. There was 1 election - Geraldine W. McClellan with 189 votes.

BALLOT #2: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Paul Butler to offer a prayer before the vote. Voting began.

MOTION: John Denmark moved that the Secretary read only the names of those who have received 50 or more votes. Motion carried.

MOTION: Bill Flanders made the motion to restrict the number of persons on the ballot to a percentage of persons needed for vote. This action would serve to remove the names of persons from the ballot thus streamlining the balloting process. Motion failed.

COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Gerald F. Van Dyken, Jr., Chair, to guide us through debate on the resolutions before the Conference. The first is entitled "Fairness in Representation" and is found on page 96 of the Workbook. Terrell Sessums spoke to this resolution. Resolution carried. The second is entitled "Revision of Charles Wesley Hymns" which had been distributed to the delegates. An amendment to the Resolution was offered by Eloise Nenon which changed the language in several places to move 'the responsibility of this resolution to the General Conference level.' She spoke to the amendment. Two persons from the Discipleship Ministry Team spoke to the amendment. Two persons spoke to the enduring testimony of the Wesleyan hymns of our tradition and of the need to preserve them for others. Amendment to the resolution failed. Original resolution was then voted on and carried. The third resolution is entitled "Iraq" and is found on page 25 of the Welcome Book. There was no discussion. The Resolution carried. The fourth is entitled "Call for Accountability" and is found on page 24 of the Welcome Book. A standing vote was taken. The vote was 750 for and 356 against. The Resolution carried. (See Resolutions)

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay Ballot #2. There were 745 ballots cast. There were 25 invalid ballots. There were a total of 720 valid ballots. 361 votes were needed to elect. There were 2 elections - Alex Arthur Shanks with 393 votes, Manuel E. Rodriguez with 376 votes, and Annie Woods with 361 votes. Carmen then read the results of Clergy Ballot #2. There were 307 ballots cast. There were 26 invalid ballots. There were a total of 281 valid ballots. 141 votes were needed to elect. There were 2 elections - David Dodge with 181 votes, and Riley P. Short with 154 votes.

BALLOT #3: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Bud Fowler to offer a prayer before the vote. The vote was taken.

MOTION: Gary Beam moved that the bar of the Conference be extended to include sections 204 through 208. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS:(continued) Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Gerald F. Van Dyken, Jr., Chair, to continue discussion on the

Resolutions before the Conference. The fifth Resolution is entitled "Amending the Book of Discipline's Paragraph on Abortion" and is found on page 22 of the Welcome Book. Discussion was held on the Resolution. Frank Reynolds made five grammatical changes to the text. Doug Hallman made an amendment to the Resolution. *Change "support" to "with" and reinsert last three lines substituting "any" for "a"*. The amendment was accepted. Discussion was held on the Resolution as amended. The Resolution carried. The sixth Resolution is entitled "Methodist Bishops Organize Against Gambling Forces" was distributed to the delegates. There was discussion from the floor. Resolution carried.

MOTION : Frank Furman made the motion to suspend the Standing Rules of the Conference that all further speeches on the Resolutions be limited to 2 minutes rather than the 3 minutes as allowed now. Motion carried. He made a second motion to suspend the Standing Rules of the Conference and change the rule from a limit of three speakers per side to two speakers per side. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS: (continued) The seventh Resolution entitled "Save the United Methodist Student Day Special Sunday" had been distributed to the delegates. There was no discussion. Resolution carried. The eighth is entitled "Resolution on Endowment Funds for the Historically Black College and Universities of the United Methodist Church" and had been distributed to the delegates. There was no discussion. Resolution carried. The ninth Resolution is entitled "Ignorance Can Neither Be Fair Nor Just" and had been distributed to the delegates. There was discussion from the floor. The Resolution failed. The tenth Resolution is entitled "Resolutions Supporting Non-Geographic Mission-Based Districts, Conferences, or Jurisdictions" and had been distributed to the delegates. There was some discussion on the Resolution. Resolution failed. The eleventh Resolution is entitled "A Resolution to Stop Gay Teenage Suicide" and had been distributed to the delegates. There was discussion on the Resolution. Margaret Johnson offered an amendment to the Resolution which substituted the words "therefore be it resolved continue to be or become" to replace "therefore be it resolved to become." Amendment accepted by the maker of the motion. The Resolution, as amended, was then voted upon and failed.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the results of Lay Ballot #3. There were 816 ballots cast. There were 38 invalid ballots. There were a total of 778 valid ballots. 399 votes were needed to elect. There were 3 elections - Bud Fowler with 458 votes, Dorothy J. Collins with 397 votes, and Jimmy Garrett, Sr. with 391 votes. Carmen then read the results of Clergy Ballot #3. There were 336 ballots cast. There were 30 invalid ballots. There were a total of 306 valid ballots. 154 votes were needed to elect. There were 4 elections - George G. Hunter, III with 167 votes, Joseph R. MacLaren, Jr. with 166 votes, W. David McEntire with 166 votes, and Anne L. Burkholder with 159 votes.

BALLOT # 4 : Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called on Jim Goode to offer the prayer before the balloting. The vote was taken.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary made a couple of brief announcements.

BENEDICTION: The Benediction was offered by Larry Rankin.

ADJOURNMENT: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson adjourned the Conference at 5:09 p.m.

Thursday Night - June 3, 1999

MUSIC AND SONG: At 7:10 P.M. Lori Blair led the Conference in singing.

RECONVENE: Bishop Henderson reconvened the Conference at 7:31 P.M.

BALLOT RESULTS: Carmen S. Arnett, Conference Secretary read the result of Jurisdictional Lay Ballot # 4. There were 765 ballots cast. There were 11 invalid ballots resulting in a total of 754 valid ballots. The number of votes necessary to elect was 378. There was one election with Jack Dowell receiving 412 votes. Carmen then read the results of Clergy Ballot # 4. There were 222 ballots cast with 17 invalid ballots leaving a total 205 valid ballots. The total needed to elect is 153. There were two elections. Lawrence Rankin was elected with 167 votes and William Picket with 155 votes.

Jim Harnish, Chairperson, Committee on Election Procedures, reported on the diversity of the General Conference delegation to this point.

BALLOT #5: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called upon Walter Monroe to bring a word of prayer. The ballot was taken.

WORSHIP SERVICE - CELEBRATION OF LIVES WHO DARED TO SHARE JESUS; A SERVICE OF RECOGNITION OF THE RETIRING MINISTERS AND SPOUSES: The Retirement Celebration began at 7:45 P. M. with the Conference being led with a prelude by H. Trall Heitzenrater, organist. The Call to Worship was led by Tom Drick; the opening hymn was "God of Grace and God of Glory" followed by a Prayer of Thanksgiving. Rev. James A. Mitchell introduced those who are retiring at this session of the Annual Conference. The readers were Rev. Deborah Weatherspoon and Rev. Robert Martin who read short statements about each retiree. Bishops Knox and Henderson presented each of the retirees with a certificate commemorating his or her years of ministry. Reverends J. C. Powell and Kimberly Cott participated in the ceremony of the passing of the torch. The Lakeland Chorus gave a witness through music. Rev. Preval Floreal read the scripture lesson from Ezekiel 37:1-14; Isaiah 49:6-10,14-16; John 16:33 followed by the message brought by Bishop George W. Bashore

Pleasant United Methodist Church, then led us in the Bible Study on Philippians 4:4-7 with the theme "Praising the Lord." The Bible Study closed with the singing of "He Touched Me." Lori Blair and the Signing Choir led the Conference in "Holy, Holy, Holy" followed by her moving rendition of "How Great Thou Art."

ORGANIZATION OF THE DAY: Bishop Lloyd Knox asked for the Bishop of Cuba, Ricardo Pereira, to share a word of blessing before he departed. The Conference Secretary was instructed to send letters of love and best wishes to Bishop Hunt and Bishop Blackburn.

COMMITTEE ON JOURNAL: George Dettman reported for the Committee on Journal. The minutes of Thursday's proceedings have been examined and found to be in order. Motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was approved.

RESULTS OF BALLOT # 6 (Jurisdictional): Total number of Clergy Ballots cast was 185 with 4 invalid ballots for a total of 181 valid ballots. The total of votes needed to elect was 91. There were three elections: Kendall Taylor 114 votes, Migdalia L. Icaza-Willets 105 votes, Pamela Ann Cahoon 102 votes. Total number of Lay Ballots cast was 494 with 25 invalid ballots leaving 469 valid

ballots. The Jurisdictional Reserves elected: June Johns 266 votes, Barbara Stricklin 245 votes, Judith Pierre-Okerson 188, Lois A. Yost 163 votes. Glenna K. Brayton 155 votes, Opal Winebrenner 148 votes, Owen R. Bliven 118 votes. The balloting of the lay was completed.

BALLOT # 7 (Clergy Jurisdictional Reserve): Clergy are now to vote for 7 reserve delegates. Bishop Knox invited Jim Reeher to offer a prayer before the balloting began. The ballot was taken.

SPECIAL MUSIC: A delightful song was brought to us by Fred Bonsteel's elementary age granddaughter, Brandy Acock.

COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS: (continued) Following an announcement, Bishop introduced Gerald Van Dyken to continue with the report on the Committee on Resolutions. The twelfth Resolution is entitled "The Florida Conference Acts Dioxin-Free Future" and is found on page 17 of the Welcome Book. This resolution was brought by the Environmental Justice Task Force of the Florida Conference Church and Society Ministry Team. It was spoken to by Margaret Broussard of the Task Force. An amendment to strike the words "investigate and" in the section which begins, "Therefore Be It Resolved" was offered. The amendment was accepted. An amendment was offered which changed the original resolution as follows: The fourth "Whereas" should now read, "*WHEREAS: Exposure to toxic chemicals such as dioxin is widely suspected to be related to the increasing rates of cancer and to increasing reproductive problems such as low sperm counts and deformed reproductive organs in the United States and elsewhere;*" and then following the fourth "WHEREAS" another "WHEREAS" which reads "*WHEREAS: Dioxin acts like a powerful and persistent hormone that is capable of producing lasting effects at very low doses;*" Amendment passed. Bishop Knox then ruled the Resolution out of order due to lack of explanation as to the matter of Conference funding as specified in the Standing Rules. The thirteenth Resolution is entitled "Peace With Justice" and is found on page 18 of the Welcome Book. An amendment was moved that made a change in the 'Be It Further Resolved' paragraph ... replace the words "*be urged to vote*" with the word "*affirm*". The amendment was accepted by the author. The Resolution failed. The fourteenth is entitled "Assistance for the Hearing Impaired" and is found on page 19 of the Welcome Book. A change accepted that the word "can" to "to." Resolution approved. The fifteenth is "entitled" National Plan Hispanic Ministry" and is found on page 20 of the Welcome Book. Resolution passed. There was offered an amendment in the 'Be It Therefore Resolved' section, strike 'provide financial' and replace with 'consider.' Amendment passed. The Resolution is adopted. The sixteenth is entitled "Igniting Ministry" and is found at the Usher's Table. An amendment to make a change in the 'Be It Therefore Resolved' section, strike 'provide financial' and replace with 'consider' and to strike the last section which begins with the asterisk. Amendment passed. The Resolution is adopted. The seventeenth is entitled "Children's Health and the Environment" and is found on page 25 of the

Workbook. Margaret Broussard spoke to the Resolution. The Resolution passed. The eighteenth is entitled "Roll Back Gambling" and is found at the Usher's Table. The Resolution was adopted. (See Resolutions)

Motion to reconsider Resolution # 9. Motion failed.

DARE TO SHARE VIDEO CLIP: A humorous look at process of voting for delegates.

BALLOT (CLERGY JURISDICTIONAL RESERVES): Total number of ballots cast was 233, the invalid ballots were 39 resulting in 194 valid ballots. Elected as Jurisdictional Reserves were Marta Jan Burke 55, Jose P. Bove 52, Walter D. Edwards 51, Michael C. Oliver 50, Montfort C. Duncan, Jr. 46, J. Clarke Campbell-Evans 41, Matthew S. Hartsfield 38. Jim Harnish gave his final report on the diversity of the delegation. The entire delegation is composed of 24 women, 41 men, 51 Anglo-American, 7 African-American, 7 Hispanic-American, a Asian-American, and 2 Deacons. Appreciation by Jim Harnish was expressed for the work of Carmen Arnett, Conference Secretary, the Ballot Overseers, Tellers, and others.

BOARD OF PENSIONS: Bishop Knox introduced James A. Mitchell who then introduced Keith Ewing who brought words from the General Board of Pensions. He explained the new schedule for the distribution of quarterly reports due to the recent conversion to state-of-the-art computerization. Ron Coleman, our liaison to the General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits, was introduced to the Conference. The Conference was directed to the five reports found on page 32 of the Workbook. Motion to approve Report # 1- Past Service Rate: Passed. Motion to approve Report # 2 - Special Grants: Passed. Motion to approve Report # 3 - Apportionment Recommendation for 2000 with the proper referral to CFA. Passed. Motion to approve Report # 4 - Housing/Rental Allowance Resolution: Adopted. Motion to approve Report # 5 - Resolution on Benefits for Deacons in Full Connection: Passed. David Dodge was introduced for the purpose of recommending adjustments to years of service record. David Dodge moved that Walter McMullen be given credit for the years of service 1957 through 1964. Approved. (See Reports)

JOINT COMMITTEE ON DISABILITY: The report is found on page 35 of the Workbook. Added to the list of those receiving disability benefits was the name of Albert Hicks. (See Reports)

PREACHER'S RELIEF BOARD: William Pickett was introduced to speak to the report found on page 27 of the Workbook. The following list of nominees to serve on the Preacher's Relief was offered: (Lay) John Collier, Debbie Garvin, Charlotte Hedberg, Harold McCarthy, Maida Pou, Melba Rilot (Clergy) Patty Daniels, Jeanne Davis, Lee FerDon, John Harrington, Rodney McClarnon,

James Mitchell, William Pickett. Elected by the Annual Conference. (See Reports)

HEALTH INSURANCE COMMITTEE: Gerald Lossing was called upon to give the report on the Health Insurance Committee. Members of the committee were asked to stand. Praise was given to the service provided by the Board of Pensions. A study has been made on the approaching unfunded liability which will result from the growing number of retired clergy who will need health insurance benefits. He introduced Rodney McClarnon to speak on this issue. It was stated that over the next 20 years there will be an unfunded liability of \$54 million for health insurance for retirees. There will be coming in the year 2000 a report which will speak to this issue. An invitation was given to all to communicate their ideas and questions with David Dodge or Rodney McClarnon before that time. Gerald Lossing made reference to the report beginning on page 37 of the Workbook. Presented to the Conference were the five recommendations found on page 38 of the Workbook. These recommendations were brought to the Conference for vote. The recommendations (1 through 5) were approved. Correction on the second recommendation was made to replace '1999' with and '2000.' The report as a whole was voted upon and accepted. (See Reports)

COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION: Bishop Lloyd Knox introduced Morgan Wright, Jr. and Thomas W. Marston. The report is found on page 83 of the Workbook. Tom Marston was asked to assist in the presentation of the recommendations found there. Recommendation #1. Setting of District Superintendant Compensation. Passed. (*NOTE: The listing of salaries of those serving beyond the local church is to be listed in the 1999 Journal*) [in response to a question by Bob Temple] Recommendation #2 - Mileage Figure: Approved. Recommendation #3 - Housing Allowances: Approved. Recommendation # 4 - Budget: Approved. Recommendation # 5- Fair Share Formula: Approved. Recommendation # 6 - Pension Fund Apportionment: Approved. Recommendation #7 - Budget Requests: Approved. Recommendation # 8 - Accordance with the Rules and Discipline: Approved. Recommendation # 9 - Christian Education Sunday: Approved. Recommendation # 10 - Retirement of Indebtedness on Barnett Lodge: Approved. Frank Furman was introduced to report on our self-insurance program. He recognized the staff including Jim Severance, and assisting him Jenny Albritton, and representatives from our agent of record, Arthur Gallagher Insurance, Brett Everett and Ed Whipple. Our program receives over \$4 million of premiums and provides coverage Churches and Conference property. Frank Furman emphasized the need to accurately report the contents of our Churches. Also, there was concern expressed over the rising problems in regard to relational risks such as termination of employment. Tom Marston asked the staff to stand and be recognized. He reported that the projects approved by the Cabinet and the Council on Finance and Administration involving communications, computer network, and Leesburg reservation system had been completed. Bishop Knox asked for an update on

our connectional giving. Tom Marston shared that the connectional giving is down 2 % from 1998. The report as whole was adopted. (See Reports)

MOTIONS FROM THE CABINET: Bishop Knox introduced Clarke Campbell-Evans, Superintendent of the Miami District, to bring a motion from the Cabinet. He brought the following motion from the Cabinet: *"I move that the Florida Annual Conference endorse the Inner City Initiative started by our Bishop Cornelius Henderson. This initiative, in partnership with our General Board of Global Ministries, will focus upon urban and urban-like areas within our Conference. It is designed to support and develop comprehensive ministries that introduce people to Jesus, nurture vital ministries, alleviate suffering, and advocate for justice and peace. I further move that we ask the Inner City Task Force to develop a comprehensive plan for our Conference and to establish criteria for evaluating effective ministries in these critical areas of our state."* Motion approved. Then Montfort Duncan, Superintendent of the DeLand District, came to present the recommendation on behalf of the Jacksonville and DeLand Districts regarding the changing of district boundaries. *"I move that the boundary between the DeLand and Jacksonville Districts be as follows: North: From State Road 13 to State Road 16. From the intersection of State Road 16 and the Saint John's River east to exit 95A on I-95. From this due east to the Atlantic Ocean."* Adopted.

SEMINARY REPRESENTATIVES: Wes Brown from Duke University School of Divinity and Steve Harper of Asbury Theological Seminary were asked to share with the Conference.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Carmen Arnett made several announcements.

ADJOURNMENT: Bishop Knox recognized the return of Bishop Henderson. He then called upon Morris Hintzman to offer a word of prayer. Adjourned at 11:48 am.

Friday Afternoon, June 5, 1999

MUSIC AND SONG: The Chapel Choir from the Florida United Methodist Children's Home shared with the Conference their ministry in song. The choir was under the capable direction of Sarah Stinson.

CONFERENCE RECONVENES: Bishop Cornelius L. Henderson called the Conference to order at 1:55 p.m. Expression of thanks to Alex Carmichael and all his staff at the Florida United Methodist Children's Home especially the Chapel Choir.

FLORIDA UNITED METHODIST CHILDREN'S HOME: Bishop Henderson called upon Alex Carmichael, President of the Florida United Methodist Children's Home to bring the report of the Children's Home. The reports are found in the

Workbook on pages 51 through 61 and in the Welcome Book, pages 52 and 53. A special presentation was made to Bishop Henderson in the form of a prayer candle and a song. (See Reports)

PRAYER: Bishop Henderson invited Daniel Pelay to offer a word of prayer.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION: Bishop Knox introduced Tom and Beth Cook. Beth Cook is on the faculty of Candler School of Theology and Tom, an attorney, served as Chancellor with Bishop Knox .

CONFERENCE COUNCIL ON MINISTRIES: Bishop Henderson invited Bill Walker and James Jennings to bring the report of the Council on Ministries. The whole report was brought to the Annual Conference including the additions of the Conference Advance Specials the Branches Youth Ministry of Florida City and the Miami District Haitian Ministry Church and Community Worker. Bill Walker then introduced Ron Pecora, Chairperson of Communications Ministry Team, who, in turn, introduced the video on United Methodist Communications and the 'Igniting Ministry' campaign. In trial markets, the campaign raised by 40% the community awareness of the United Methodist Church. Also shown were three sample television spots. Bishop Knox asked for a motion on the spirit of the resolution on being a dioxin-free Church. Motion by David Brazelton, clergy. *"Due to the dangers of dioxin, we, the Florida Annual Conference, request all Conference organizations and local churches to urge United Methodists to seek and purchase paper products which have not been processed with chlorine. We further request local churches ask their vendors to obtain chlorine-free paper, or that churches who buy paper goods directly seek chlorine-free papers. We request this information be published in the Florida Methodist Review as soon as possible."* Motion passed.
